## Paedophile ring in Cornwall (Transcript)

CBC: And turning now to our special series, Breach of Trust. At least 50 people have come forward in Cornwall, Ontario with stories of sexual abuse. They say that a group of paedophiles operated in the area for decades. Twelve men have been charged so far. There have been four police investigations as officers analyze the complaints. Police claim there are no links between any of the alleged victims. But two probation officers involved in the abuse were co-workers. Their office was a hub of activity as they shared victims. Maureen Brosnan has this report. And we caution that it contains language that some people may find disturbing.

REPORTER: When Albert Roy was 16 he got drunk, he stole a car, he pleaded guilty. But the young, naive boy's sentence of probation turned into a lifetime of pain. That's because Roy was sexually abused by two probation officers in Cornwall. The first was Nelson Bark, the second, Ken Sagan.

ALBERT ROY (Victim): What I was looking for is somebody to give me some guidance. Somebody to make me feel good about myself. And I thought these people were. And...but they had their own agenda.

REPORTER: Roy says Bark got to him first. Plying him with booze which he wasn't supposed to have. And then forcing him into oral sex. When he complained to Bark's supervisor, Ken Sagan, Sagan began abusing him as well. He said the two tried to convince him this was normal.

ROY: Both him and Ken used to tell me stories about...like Roman soldiers, before they became men, slept with men to bring them into manhood. And at the time I had this feeling like these are educated men, they know what they're talking about. They're good people

REPORTER: Roy was not alone. Other young men in the Cornwall area have now revealed they were sexually abused by probation officers. Ted Carnie is one. He says Ken Sagan began abusing him two weeks after his probation started. He says he tried to stay away. But Sagan showed up at his mother's house.

TED CARNIE (Victim): And she thought the world of him. She...you know, he's such a nice man because he always a nice...he put himself across as a very nice, concerned individual.

REPORTER: He says his mother forced him to go back to the office with Sagan.

CARNIE: I had to go in his car and go back...you know he says, you know, you're not being very cooperative Ted. You could go, you know you could get in a lot of trouble for not being cooperative and all this shit.
