Inspector Ron MacKay joined the R.C.M.P. in 1961 and following recruit training, was posted to British Columbia where he served until 1984. His service was divided between northern B.C. and the lower mainland, as well as uniform and plain clothes duty. Part of his duties for a two-year period included working with Vancouver Rape Relief and the B.C. Police Commission on the development of a film for use in North Vancouver Detachment, General Investigation Section, where the bulk of his duties involved investigation of major crime. In 1984 he was transferred to H.Q. Ottawa, where he worked in several units concerned with counter-terrorism until his acceptance into the police fellowship. As Officer in Charge of Violent Crime Analysis Section, he is responsible for all Criminal Investigative Analysis and the development of a national program in this regard, so as to ensure this new service and the Major Crime File compliment each other to the fullest extent possible.
