1984	Criminal Investigation Section starts the design of a Case Management of Major Investigations Module This five-day module will be a mandatory component of the Advanced Criminal Investigation Diploma. This is the first formal Case Management Training in Canada.	OPC
1985 – 1994	Case Management Module in different forms is delivered in a five-day format at the Ontario Police College.	OPC
Fall, 1992	Canadian Police College under leadership of Sgt. Mike Shaver, RCMP hosts first working group to design a Major Case Management Course at CPC. Working group consist of senior investigators from across Canada.	CPC

June 1997	Campbell Report Implementation Project was formed. A/Det. Superintendent Bill Van Allen, Criminal Investigation Bureau, Ontario Provincial Police is named Project Director. Phil DeBruyne, Ontario Police College, seconded to OPP Criminal Investigation Bureau is reassigned to Project as the Ontario Major Case Management Manual Coordinator responsible for investigative standards for the purpose of case managing and investigating defined major cases. Subsequently Phil DeBruyne would also assume the role of OMCM training coordinator. Other members are assigned to the project team to address issues around software, serial crime, and work with the OMCM Committee.	CRIP
